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Introduction and Background

The Training and Assessment report is a snapshot overview of data and outlines the most recent numbers for:

- » Enrolments
- » Trainees and Specialist International Medical Graduates (SIMG)
- » Assessment pass rates
- » New and current RANZCP Fellows
- » Certificates of advanced training
- » Continuing professional development (CPD)
- » Membership

The Mid-year update data is current as at 23 July 2021 and summarises activities for January – June 2021.

Importantly, the data published in the respective sections are aggregated for each state and New Zealand. However, the definition of location changes according to the member type:

- » Trainees: the Fellowship zone is used to determine location
- » SIMGs: the employer state is used to determine location
- » New Fellows: the last Fellowship zone recorded is used to determine location
- » Affiliates and current Fellows: the residential/mailing address is used to determine location.

The data for this report is taken from the College member database, and the analysis was conducted by the Education and Training Unit as part of its regular reporting of the College's education activities. Numbers may differ from other reports due to trainees moving zone, late form submission, withdrawals, not paying fees, being excluded or other reasons. Results presented in this report have been rounded up to the nearest whole percent and in some cases, answers may not add up to 100%.

1. RANZCP Fellowship program enrolment

During the first half of the 2021 training year, a total of 263 trainees commenced the RANZCP Fellowship program (see Table 1).

The 2021 training year commenced in February 2021 for Australia and New Zealand. The figures for enrolments include trainee intakes for the period February – June 2021.

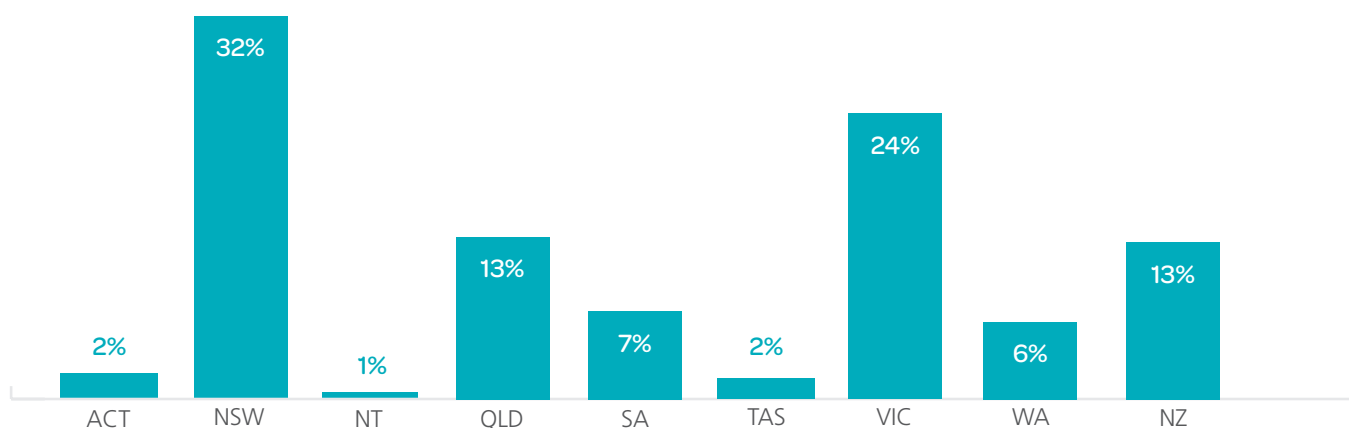


Figure 1. Training intake by location (%)

2. RANZCP Fellowship program numbers

Overall, the College has 1,973 active trainees (1,685 in Australia, 234 in New Zealand and 54 No Zone). Table 2 provides the distribution of trainees across each stage of training and Fellowship zone. Overall, 1,872 trainees (95%) are undertaking the 2012-program, and 110 trainees (5%) have transitioned from the 2003 program.

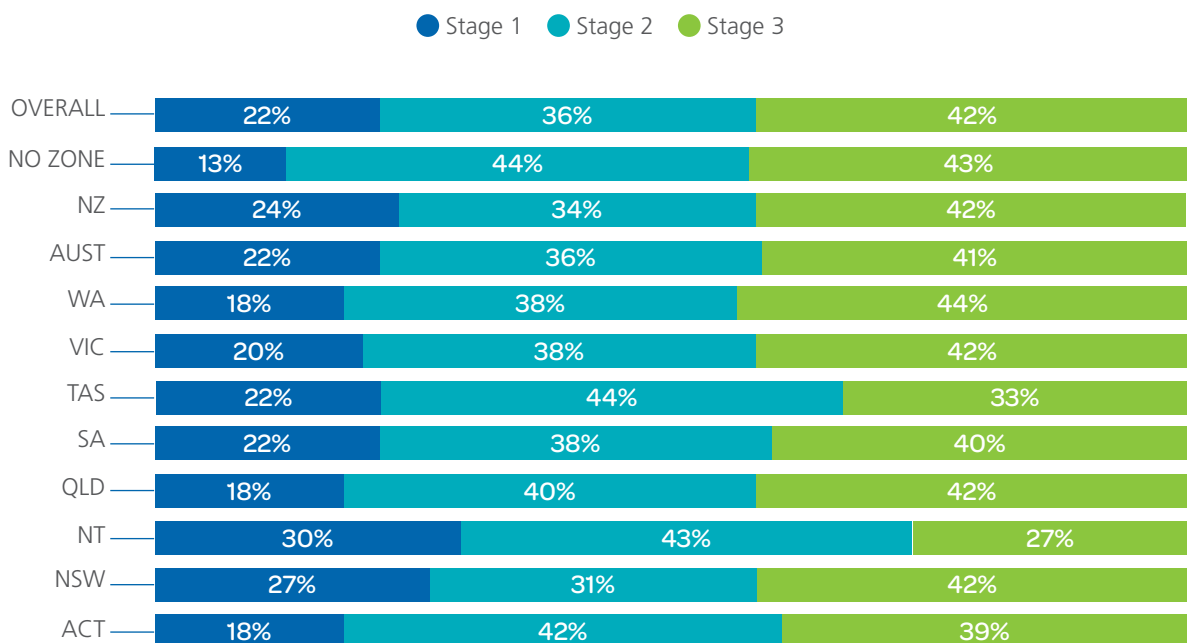


Figure 2. Trainees by Fellowship Zone and Stage of Training (correct as of 23 July 2021)

The distribution of trainees across each stage of training and location is presented in Figure 2. NZ, WA, VIC, SA, QLD, and NSW have the highest proportion of their trainees in stage 3; TAS, NT and ACT in stage 2.

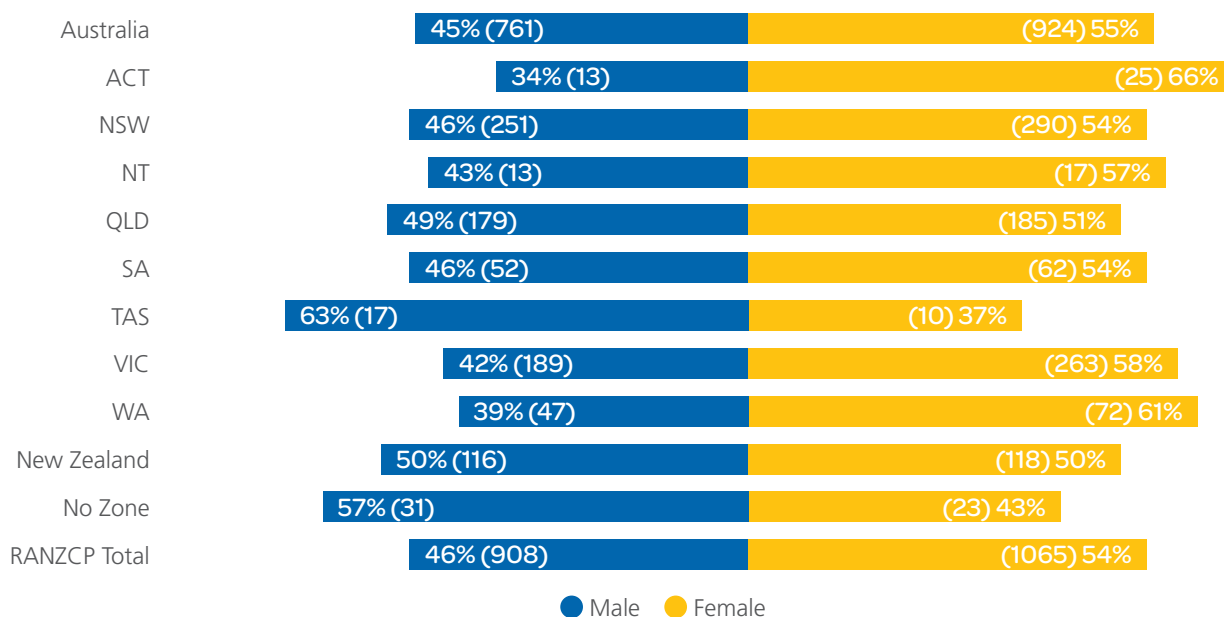


Figure 3. Distribution of trainees by Fellowship Zone and gender (correct as of 23 July 2021)

The distribution of trainees by zone and gender is presented in Figure 3. Females represent more than 50% of RANZCP trainees, particularly in ACT and WA where 66% and 61% are female respectively. Tasmania has the lowest percentage of females in the program, where the proportion is 37%.

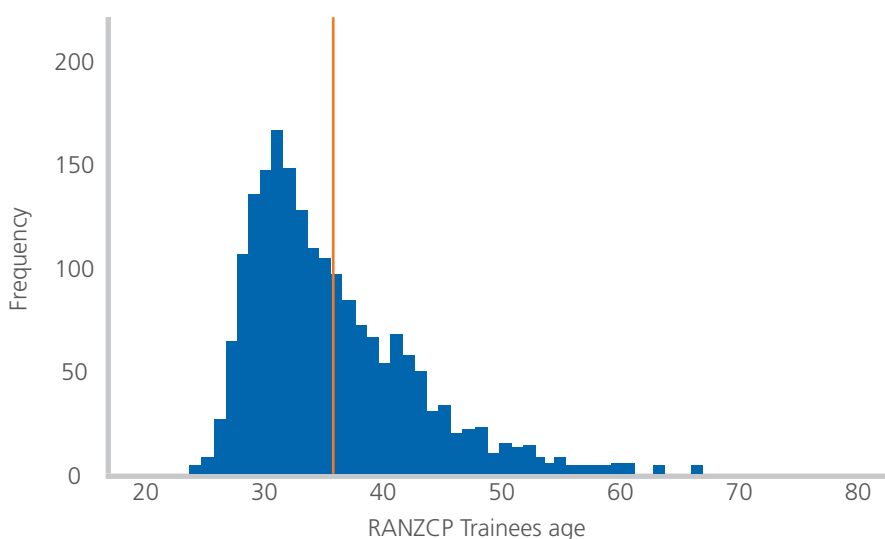


Figure 4. RANZCP trainees age distribution (correct as of 23 July 2021)

Table 3 and Figure 4 show the range and frequency of the age of RANZCP trainees. The RANZCP trainees are ranging from 24 years to 73 years of age. The average age is 35.66 years, with a standard deviation of +/- 7.180 years and the most common age group is 31 to 40 years (52.9%).

3. Assessments

3.1 Multiple Choice Question (MCQ) Examination

The Multiple-Choice Question (MCQ) Examination was held in March 2021 and the pass rate was 95% from a total of 111 assessments completed. The majority of trainees were successful in their first attempt. Results by Fellowship zone and number of attempts are shown in Table 4, and 5 respectively.

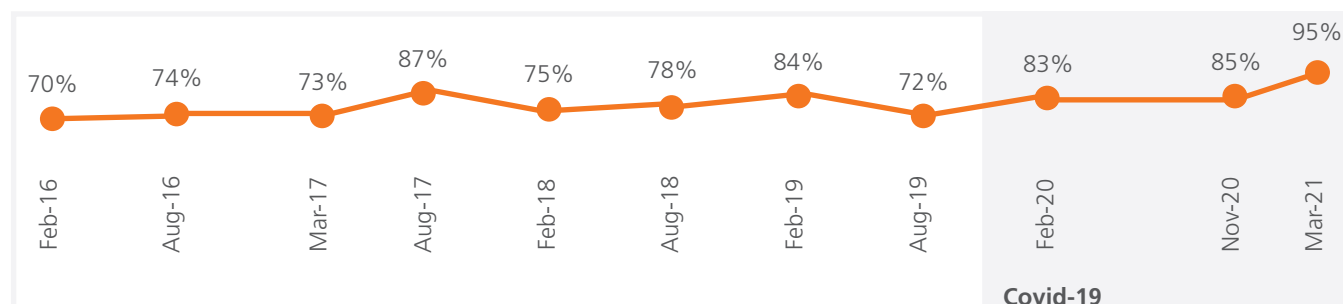


Figure 5. MCQ Pass-Rates

3.2 Essay-style Examination

The Essay-style Examination pass rate for February 2021 was 57% from a total of 201 assessments completed. More than 60% of trainees were successful in the first attempt. Results by Fellowship zone and number of attempts are shown in Table 6 and 7, respectively.

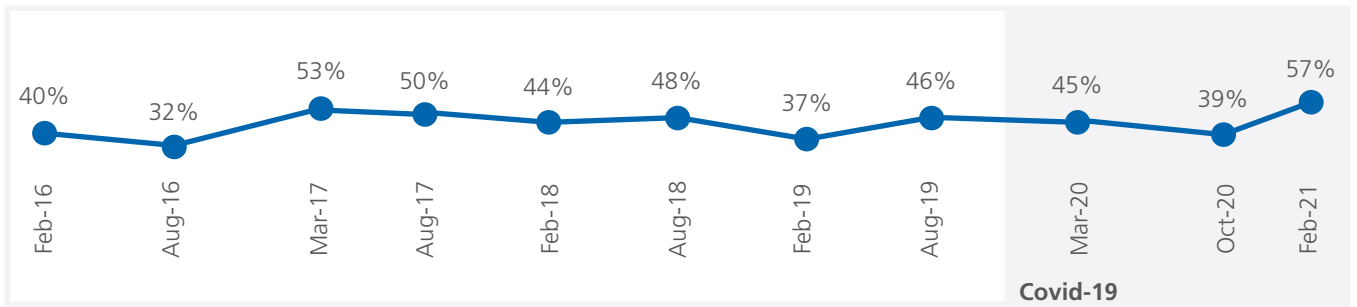


Figure 6. ESSAY Style Pass-Rates

3.3 Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE)

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, public health orders in both Australia and New Zealand limited travel, placed restrictions on gatherings and introduced physical distancing requirements. In response, the College held an Audio-Visual OSCE (AVOSCE) offered to a cohort of trainees and SIMG candidates who were most likely to be able to complete Fellowship during 2021. The Overall pass rate for the AVOSCE was 67% from a total of 69 candidates. The results by Fellowship zone, trainee type and pathway, and number of attempts are shown in Tables 8, 9 and 10, respectively.

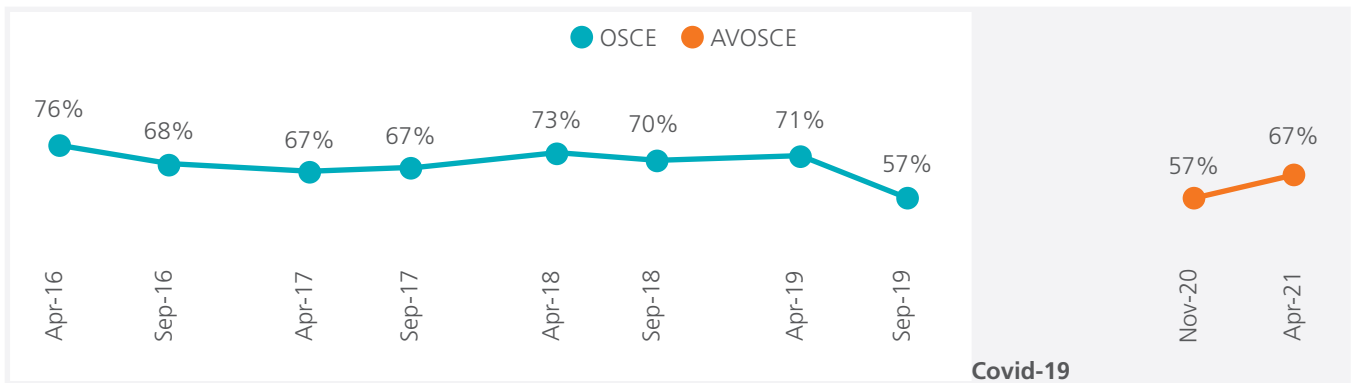


Figure 6. OSCE and AVOSCE Pass-Rates

3.4 Psychotherapy Written Case (PWC)

The Psychotherapy Written Case (PWC) results for submissions received in February and May 2021 are summarised in Table 11 to Table 13, including the pass rates by Fellowship zone and attempt. A total of 137 submissions were assessed, and 68% passed the PWC in February and 63% in May.

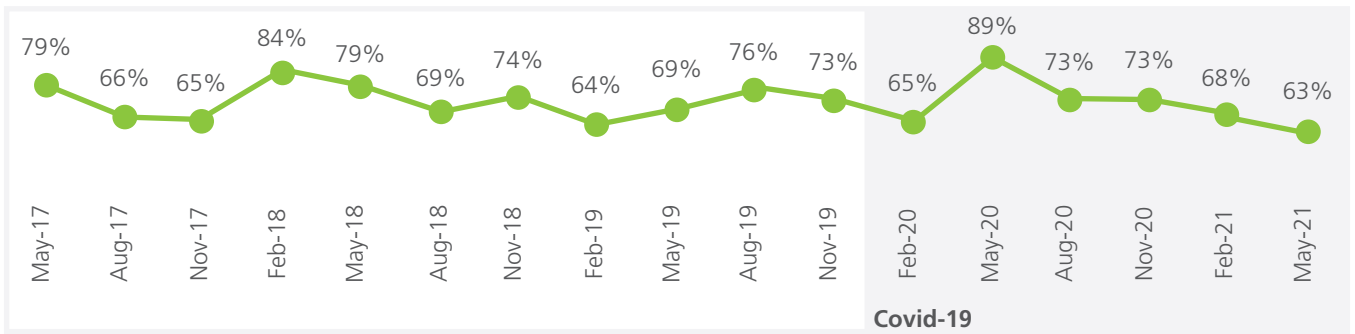


Figure 7. PWC Pass-Rates

3.5 Scholarly Project (SP)

a. Submission results

During the March 2021 round of submissions, 41 Scholarly Projects were received. Of these, 80% were awarded a pass. More than 80% were successful in their first attempt. Results by Fellowship zone, number of attempts and project type are shown in Table 14 to Table 16.

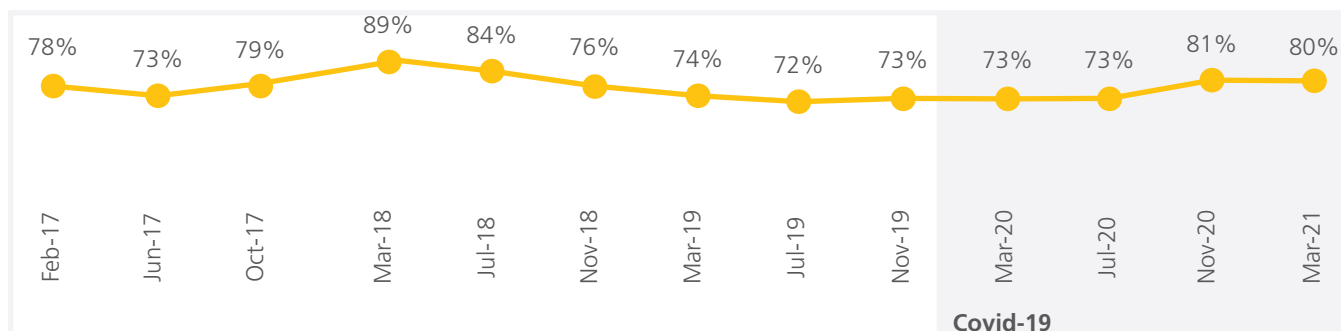


Figure 8. SP Pass-Rates

b. Proposals and exemptions

The RANZCP approved 71 SP proposals in the period January to June 2021. The Case Series was the least common project type received during the round (see Table 17).

Trainees may be exempt from undertaking SP if they have conducted activities that are considered equivalent by the RANZCP. During the first half of the year, the College received 44 applications for exemptions, and 93% of these were granted (see Table 18).

4. Specialist International Medical Graduates program enrolment

A total of 37 Specialist International Medical Graduates commenced the RANZCP trainee program during the period January to June 2021. Twenty-five (25) candidates were deemed to be substantially comparable, while an additional 12 were deemed to be partially comparable (see Table 19). The largest numbers of new overseas trainees had an employer in Victoria.

Table 20 shows the new SIMGs' country of qualifications assessed. The United Kingdom (30%) and India (27%) were the most common countries for the highest specialist qualifications that were assessed for comparability for these SIMGs.

The difference between New Zealand and Australian SIMG numbers is due to the differing pathways to vocational or specialist medical registration. New Zealand registration does not require completion of a RANZCP pathway to Fellowship. RANZCP provides for Affiliate membership for New Zealand psychiatrists who have completed the local assessment and recognition pathway

5. Specialist International Medical Graduates numbers

Overall, the College has 202 active SIMGs (198 in Australia and 4 in New Zealand). Table 21 provides the distribution of SIMGs across each comparability status and employer state. Overall, 121 SIMGs (60%) are undertaking the program under the Partial Comparability category, and 81 SIMGs (40%) under Substantial Comparability.

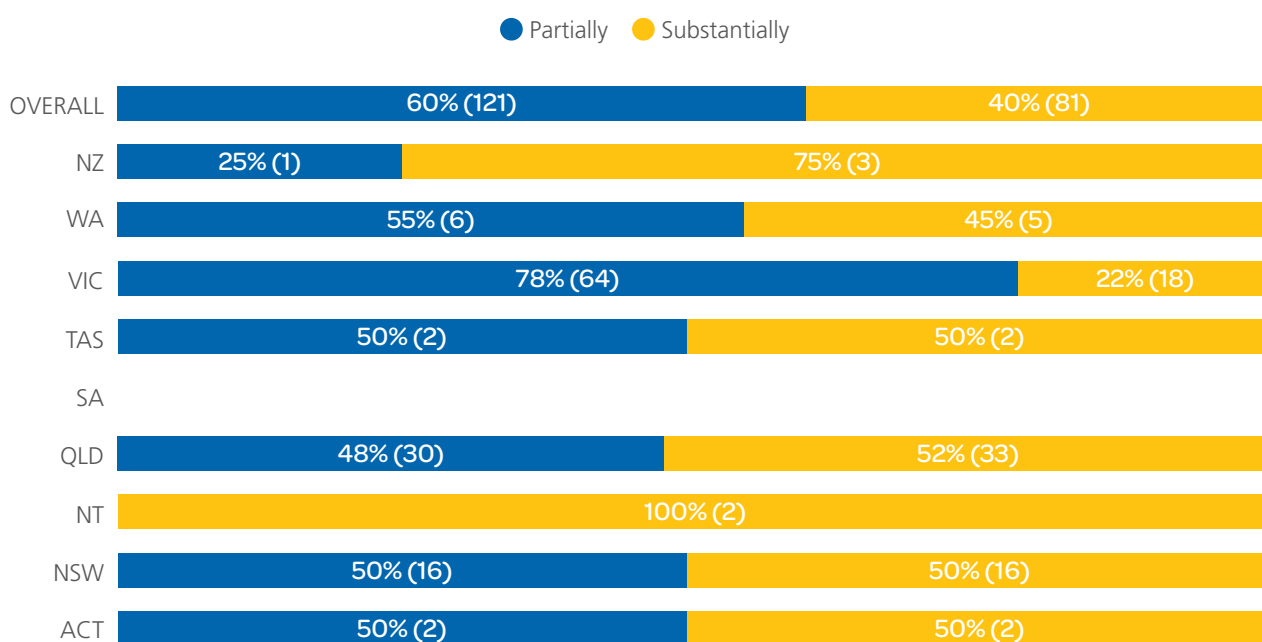


Figure 9. SIMGs by Employer State and comparability status (correct as of 23 July 2021)

The distribution of SIMGs across each comparability status and employer state is presented in Figure 9. NZ, QLD, and NT have the majority of SIMGs with Substantial Comparability and WA and VIC Partial Comparability.

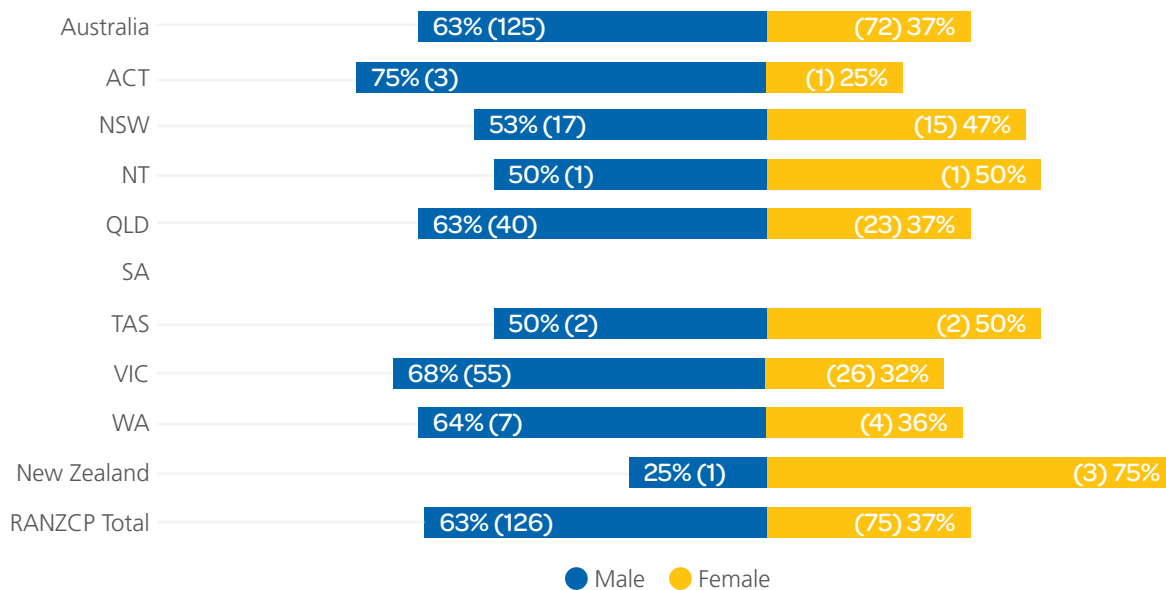


Figure 10. Distribution of SIMGs by Fellowship Zone and gender (correct as of 23 July 2021)

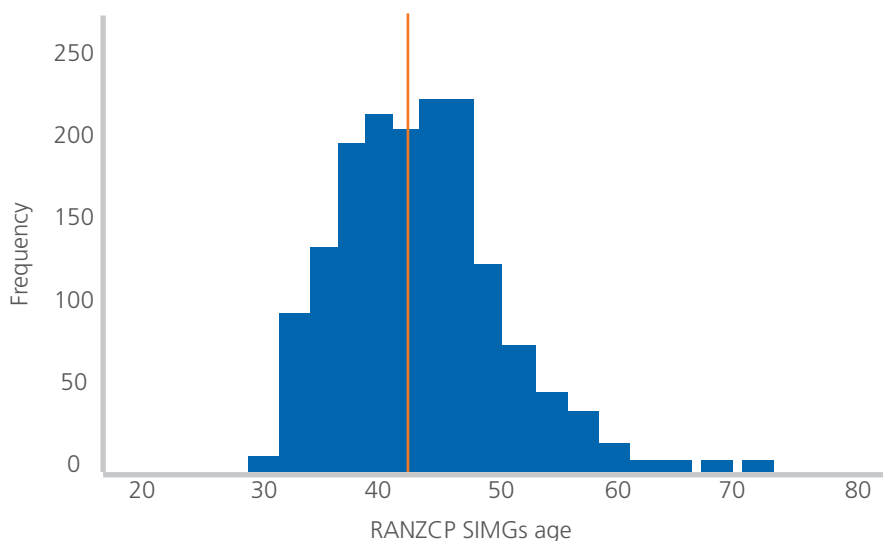


Figure 11. RANZCP SIMGs age distribution (correct as of 23 July 2021)

6. New Fellows

Over the reporting period, the RANZCP announced the admission of 125 new College Fellows with 106 (85%) completing the training program pathway and the remaining 19 (15%) following the Specialist International Medical Graduates program. 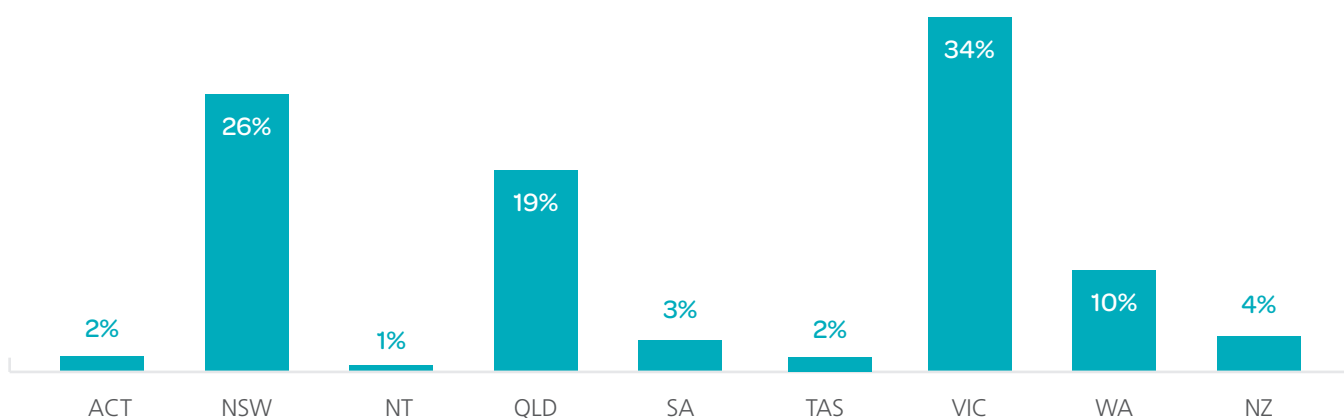


Figure 12. Percentage of New Fellows by Location (Jan-Jun 2021)

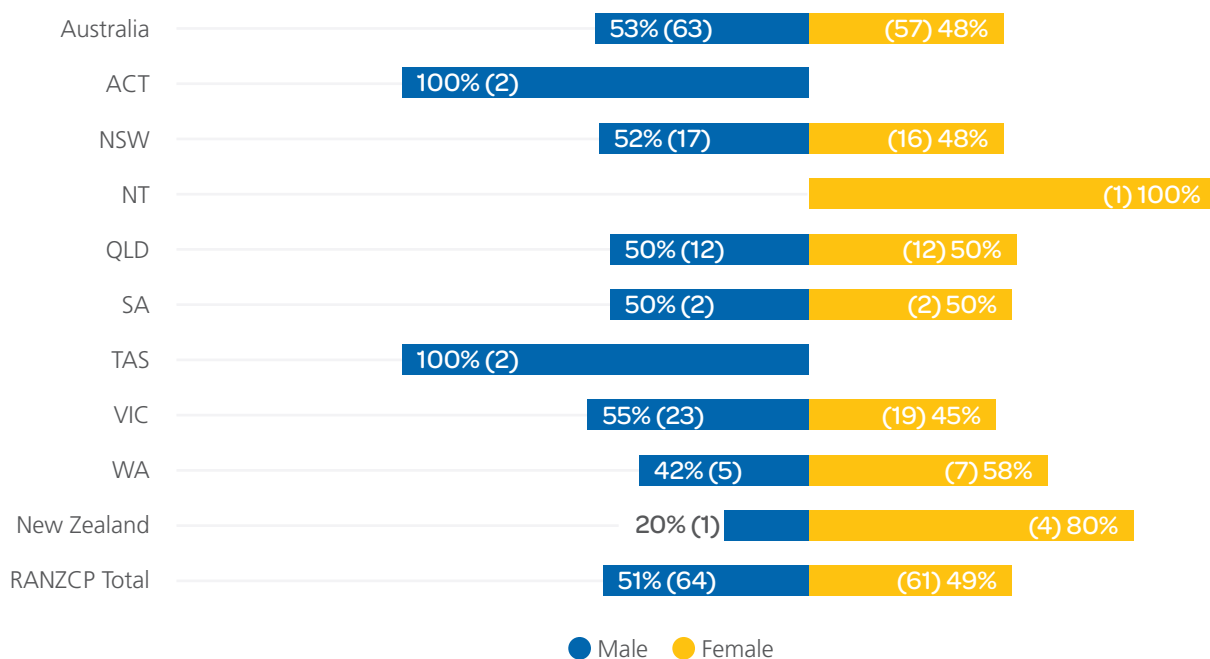


Figure 13. Distribution of New Fellows by Fellowship Zone and gender (Jan-Jun 2021)

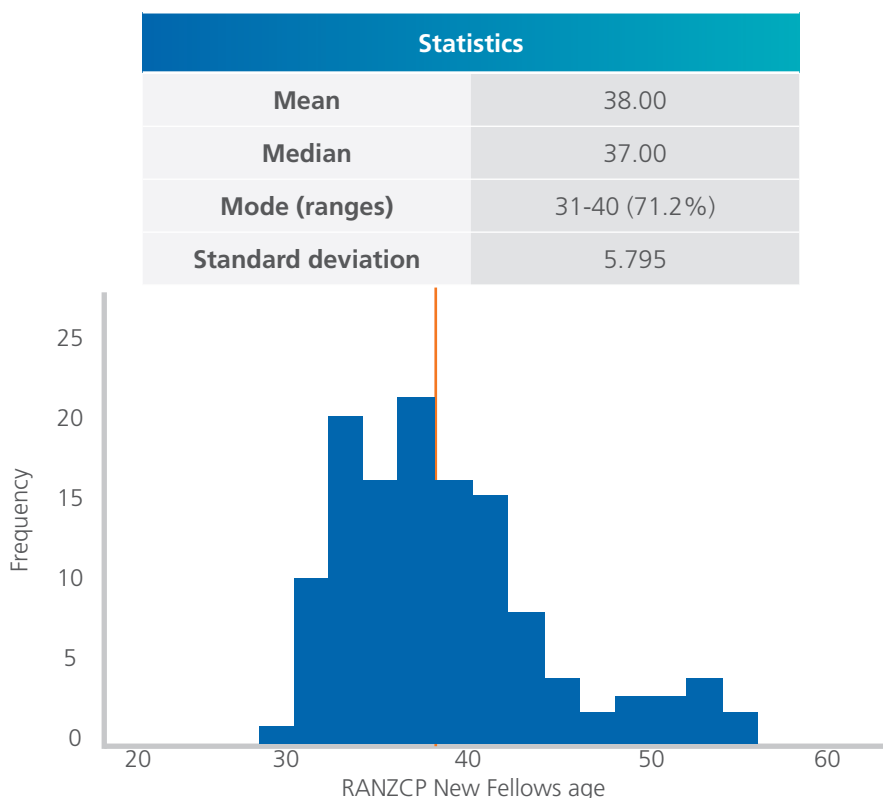


Figure 14. RANZCP New Fellows age distribution (Jan-Jun 2021)

Table 24 and Figure 14 show the range and frequency of the age of RANZCP new Fellows. The RANZCP new Fellows are ranging from 29 years to 55 years of age at the time of their admission to Fellowship. The average age is 38 years, with a standard deviation of +/- 5.795 years and the most common age group is 31 to 40 years (71.2%).

7. RANZCP Fellows

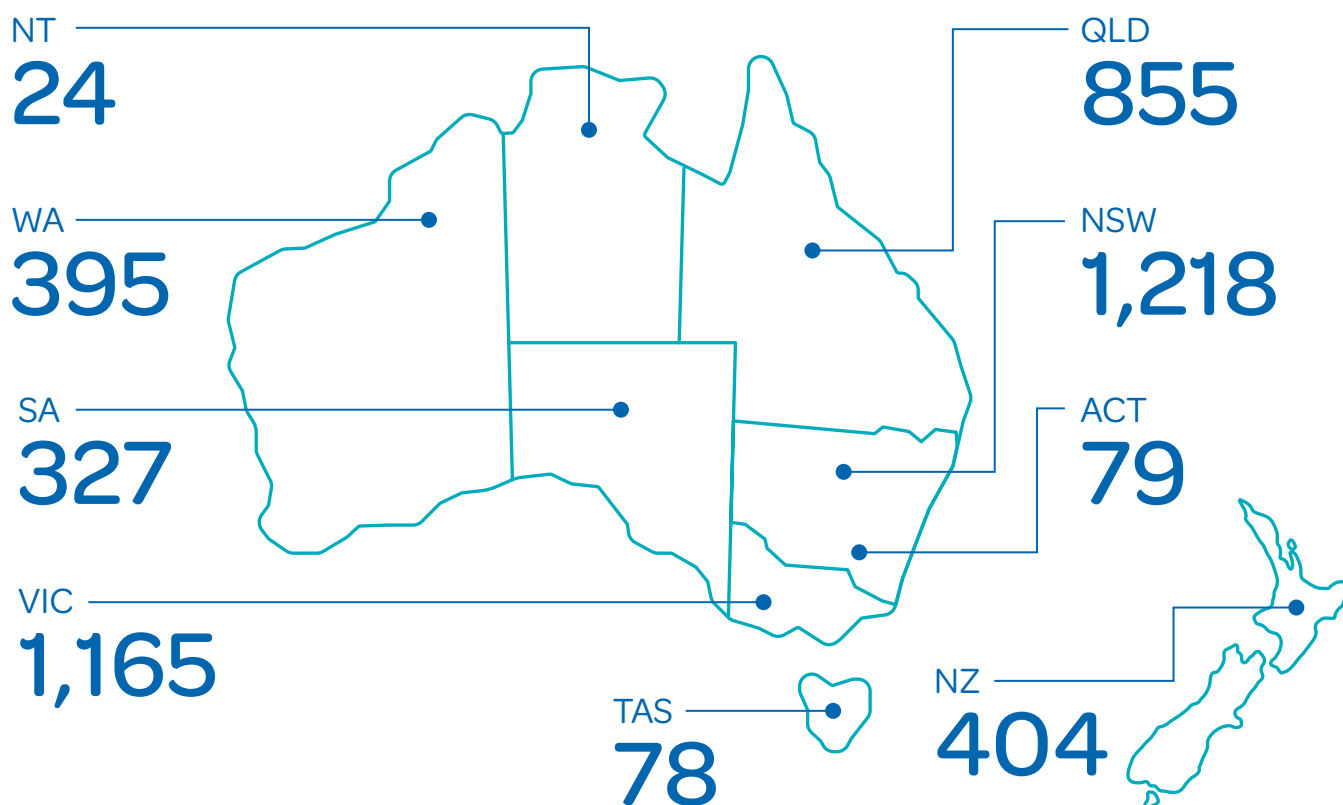


Figure 15. Fellows by Location (correct as of 23 July 2021)

As of 23 July 2021, the College had 4,669 active Fellows (excluding those who are retired or inactive) with 4,141 in Australia and 404 in New Zealand. Table 25 shows the distribution by location for the RANZCP Fellows, with figure 15 showing this information mapped in a graphical format. It should be noted that locations for Fellows are not necessarily their work location.

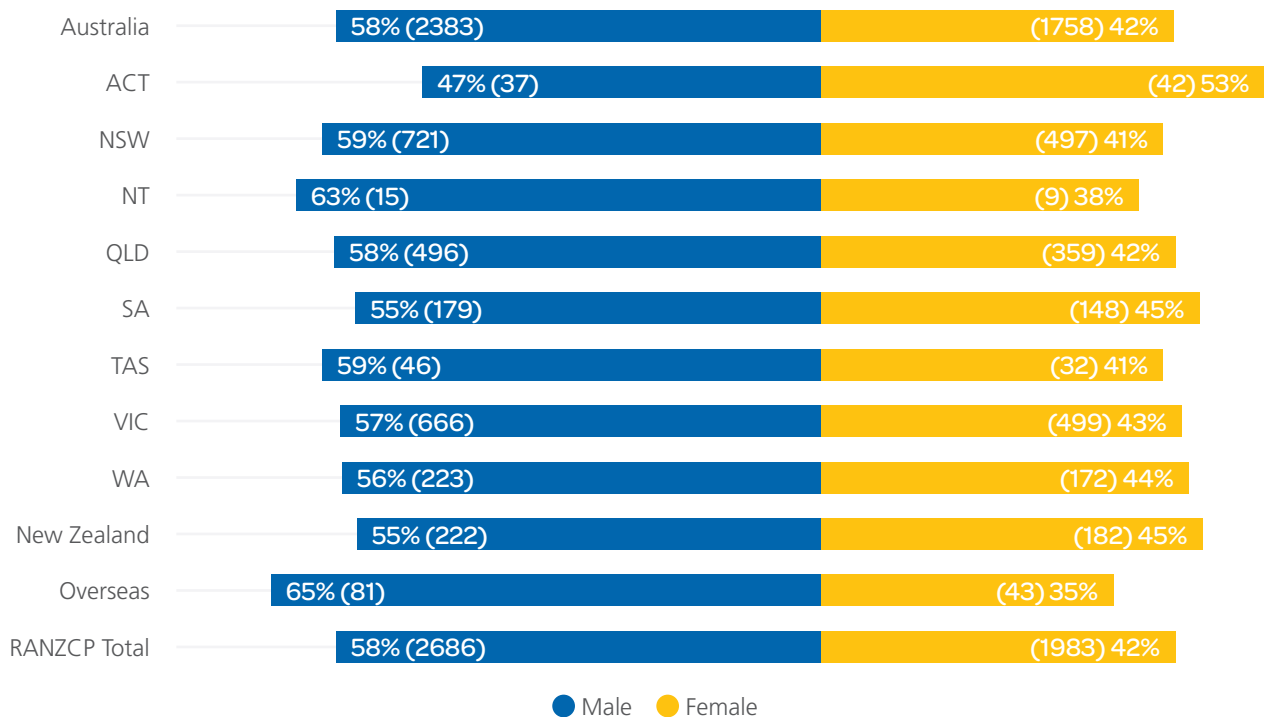


Figure 16. Distribution of Fellows by Location and gender (correct as of 23 July 2021)

The average age is 54.11 years, with a standard deviation of +/- 12.220 years and the most common age group is 41 to 50 years (30.6%), followed by 51-60 years (26.3%).

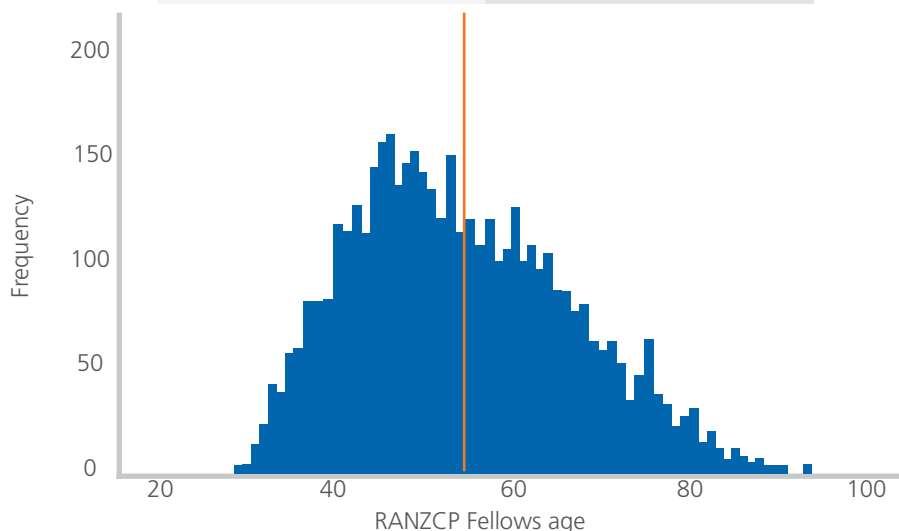


Figure 17. RANZCP Fellows age distribution (correct as of 23 July 2021)

b. RANZCP Certificates of Advanced Training numbers

Table 28 shows the total number of people currently enrolled in Certificates of Advanced Training and the detail of Membership by location is shown in Table 29. A total of 728 advanced certificates are being completed by 670 people, with the most common certificates being Consultation-Liaison, Old Age and Child and Adolescent accounting for 56% of the total. The majority of people enrolled are RANZCP trainees (56%) and the remaining Fellows (44%).

During the first half of 2021 a total of 76 Certificates of Advanced Training were approved by the Education Committee. Table 30 shows the certificates awarded by type and location.

9. Continuing Professional Development (CPD)

CPD participation is a requirement for medical registration and annual recertification of medical practitioners. Active Affiliates and Fellows (excluding those that are retired or inactive) are automatically enrolled in the CPD program. Participants need to complete a minimum of 50 hours annually.

The graphs below illustrate the progress of participants towards completion of the minimum requirement for CPD at the midpoint of the CPD year. As participants have until 31 December 2021 to complete activities, and until 31 March 2022 to report all activities, the compliance rates are as expected for this time of the year.

At 5 August 2021, 2% of CPD participants have complied with the minimum of 50 hours. Section 1 (Professional Development Plan) and Section 2 (Peer Review Activities) showed the highest levels of progress with 20% and 33% of participants respectively having completed the requirements.

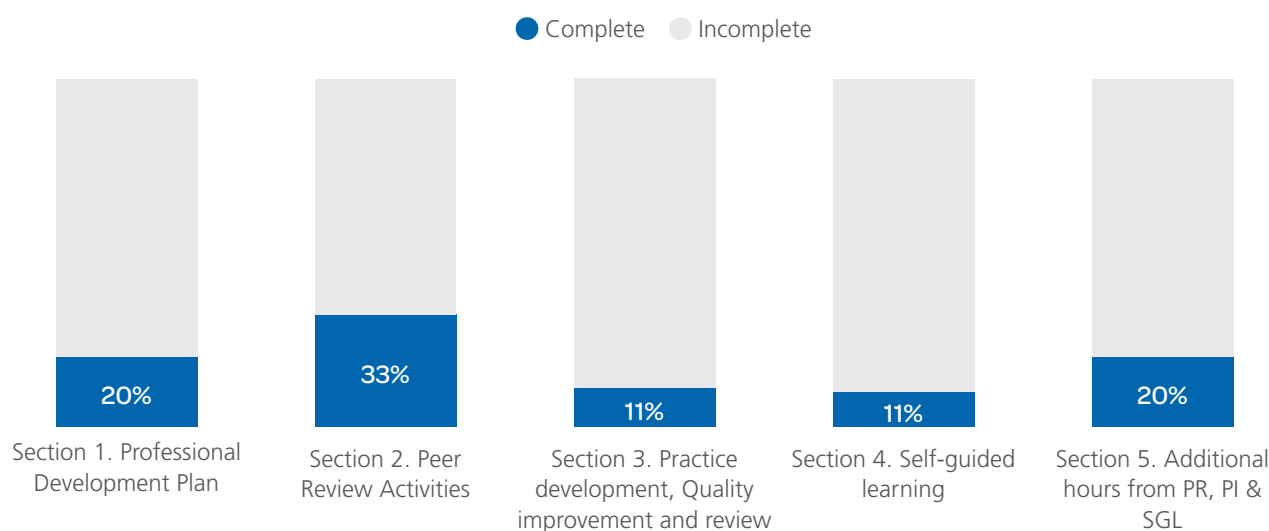


Figure 18. Completion of CPD by section (2021 CPD year)

10. RANZCP Membership consolidated

As of 23 July 2021, the College had 7,061 active Fellows (excluding those who are retired or inactive), trainees, affiliates and SIMGs, with 6,033 in Australia and 845 in New Zealand. Within Australia, there were 4,141 Fellows, 198 SIMGs, 9 affiliates and 1,685 trainees. In New Zealand, there were 404 Fellows, 203 affiliates and 234 trainees.

While RANZCP Members are located throughout Australia, they are mainly concentrated in NSW, QLD and VIC (79%). It should be noted that locations for Fellows and Affiliates are not necessarily their work location. Table 32 shows the distribution by location for the RANZCP membership.

The significant discrepancy between the numbers of Affiliates in Australia and New Zealand is related to the different registration requirements for SIMGs.
