



## **Diagnostic categories**

This table is to assist the tracking of the required diagnostic categories for the case summaries to be submitted by trainees and Fellows completing a Certificate of Advanced Training in Psychiatry of Old Age.

Diagnostic categories are prescribed to ensure reasonable coverage of both high prevalence and low prevalence disorders seen in diverse settings over the course of 24 months FTE of subspecialty training.

At least 5 of the required 40 cases must be seen in consultation—liaison settings. The resulting case summaries should reflect consultation—liaison issues.
